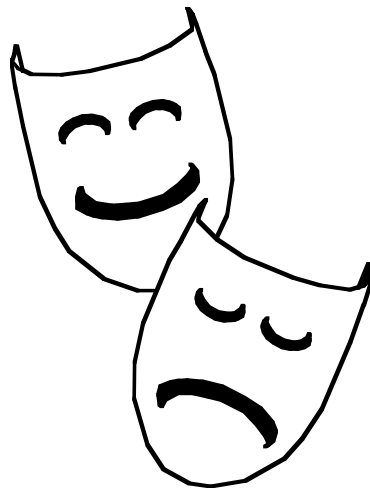

CHAIRMANS WELCOME

Welcome to the first edition of News & Views in 2007 and we send best wishes to all readers for the rest of the year.

Looking back to 2006 the society presented a much acclaimed production of Guys & Dolls and we have started the New Year yet again with the F.O.A.T. pantomime Cinderella, a first class production enjoyed by extremely good audiences. Everyone involved in both productions is to be congratulated for their efforts and the standard that they achieved.

2006 was the first year the Theatre has operated as a charitable trust, relying on its own income from hire. The results have been satisfactory but to maintain momentum it is necessary to attract as many hire bookings as possible, highlighting the need for volunteers who are prepared to give some time to support the theatre by manning the front of house and technical assistance required when the theatre is in use. The more volunteers we can get the more bookings we can accept without overwhelming any particular group of peoples time.

In an effort to solve this particular problem it is intended that efforts will be made to publicise the need for these helpers and hopefully create a volunteer membership whose interests are the theatres continued success in the community. Anyone interested should contact David Howe 01663 742961.

Looking Forward we are preparing to start the new campaign towards the 2007 production of 'Anything Goe`s, details of the first get together in this issue.

I am sure we shall attract a first class cast for this production but it is worth remembering that these productions do not just happen, a good deal of work goes on behind the scenes to ensure success and at present there is a lack of support for the production committee. The present ageing, somewhat depleted, group are anxious to find new members to bring the committee up to strength. Not a lot of time is involved, some experience of show production is desirable and not wanting to take part in the production is preferable, but not necessarily a precondition. Are there any volunteers?

For the immediate future we welcome to the theatre the coming production of 'Dancing Star' on March 1.2.3 by the newly formed Children's Musical Theatre Group, a project developed by the ambition of fifteen year old schoolgirl Jade Chamberlain to be a stage director. Jade has written the show, found the cast, directed the production and achieved a lot of publicity. So if enthusiasm and effort are a sign of things to come we are in for a good show and if Jade's ambition to continue with young peoples theatre group succeeds it can only be a benefit to the theatre and society and deserves our utmost support.

To end may I promote my own favourite, details elsewhere in this issue, we are again privileged to welcome the R.N.C.M. Jazz Collective Big Band and if you are a Big Band fan this is a concert not to be missed, see you on the night.

Following their successful appearance at the theatre in 2006 we are once again privileged to present the R.N.C.M. Jazz Collective Big Band in concert.

The band is one of two full sized jazz orchestras, which together with classes in jazz improvisation, specialist instrumental tuition and various jazz related subjects are open to all college students, who give their free time to take part.

Regular concerts in Manchester and the North at prominent venues including the Bridgewater Hall and South at the Royal Festival Hall have earned the R.M.C.M. Big Band a strong regional and national reputation.

The band aims to present a programme which reflects the full range of musical styles written for the big band format from early swing music through to contemporary writing.

MIKE HALL is a jazz saxophonist and educator. Mike heads jazz studies at R.N.C.M where he is tutor in saxophone, jazz improvisations, theory and director of the Big Band and Jazz Collective.

In his own right Mike maintains a busy performance schedule. As a world class saxophonist he heads his own quartet at a wide variety of jazz venues. His solo performances have taken him to venues worldwide and his regular freelancing includes appearances with many prominent musical organisations including Royal London Philharmonic Orchestra and The Halle Orchestra. Mike Hall's skill and dedication are very much reflected in the R.N.C.M. Big Band performance.

Over the years they have voluntarily completed many tasks

Major events such as the enlargement of the Theatre Bar area and the moving of the entrance from the bar into the circle auditorium to minor challenges of cleaning the back stage and dressing room areas

The last 12 months have seen the Monday Nighters undertake

- Repairs to some of the seating in the auditorium

- Decorating the back stage area

- Modification to the orchestra rail to allow the Musical Director direct access

- New Curtain rails over the Emergency Exits

- Preparation for the new concrete floor in the boiler room annex

- Preparation of the stage for each hiring of the Theatre

- And the dreaded installation and dismantling of the cat walk and stage thrust infill.

After the main show Guys and Dolls the Monday Nighters were straight into building the set pieces for the Pantomime Cinderella a task undertaken and completed within 6 weeks and this year we managed to take a full week off for Christmas

What's happening in the next 12 months?

- Projects in the pipeline include maintenance to the revolving stage

- Further work in the Boiler Room Annex

- Decoration repairs in the orchestra pit

- Redecoration in the auditorium circle to flaking paintwork

- Preparation of the stage for incoming events

- And tackling those little emergencies that are forever raising their head

The team is always on the lookout for help

We meet mostly on a Monday night, hence the name Monday Nighters, but sometimes another evening/weekend might be needed

What is NODA?

The National Operatic and Dramatic Association (NODA) was founded in 1899 “to protect and advance the interests of Operatic and Dramatic art and of Societies engaged therein”. It has a membership of some 2,300 amateur societies and 2,500 individual enthusiasts throughout the UK, staging musicals, opera, plays, concerts and pantomimes in a wide variety of performing venues, ranging from the country’s leading professional theatres to tiny village halls.

NODA is a registered charity with The Lord Lloyd-Webber as its patron and is divided into eleven areas, each headed by an Area Councillor who sits on the National Council (the ruling body of the association), supported by a network of Regional Representatives. These volunteers are the vital link to the grass roots of the Association, the amateur theatre companies. The association is administered from a headquarters in Peterborough, with a knowledgeable and friendly staff able to deal with virtually any enquiry relating to amateur theatre. Members have access to a wide range of benefits and advice, which includes show and play information, insurance, training courses, legal advice etc.

There is a broad spectrum of ages involved with amateur theatre nationwide, from a burgeoning number of youth groups to adult companies which meet the needs of all levels of both performers, whether dramatic or musical, and enthusiasts involved backstage, front of house or in administration.

NODA aims:

To give a shared voice to the amateur sector.

To help amateur societies and individuals achieve the highest standards of best practice and performance.

To provide leadership and advice to enable the amateur sector to tackle the challenges and opportunities of the 21st Century.
